



Year One Curriculum

Now that the children are in their final term of Year One, they will be encouraged to become more independent learners. They are now reflecting on their learning outcomes in order to improve and develop their skills.



Helpful things to remember

- PE kit
- Book bags with children's reading books
- Homework (in pencil please)
- Weather appropriate clothing





Reading

Children will continue to read to an adult weekly. This will be either individually or as part of a guided reading group. Please continue to read a little with your children each day as reading is so vital to their progress across the whole curriculum. Please also discuss the book and question your child. Comprehension is as significant a part of reading as decoding.

Please remind your children to change their reading for pleasure book independently as and when they need to.

Writing

The children will continue to focus on writing good careful sentences (with a range of punctuation and to think about using interesting nouns, verbs, adjectives, time words and conjunctions). Their individual targets will reflect this and aid their achievement.

This term we will study a range of fiction and non-fiction texts with an emphasis on extending and sustaining their writing.

At home you can support your child by giving them opportunities to discuss their ideas and supporting their interests.

Kit Kat and Biscuit will continue to be sent home weekly. Please encourage your child to write a diary entry.

Handwriting

In the Summer term there is an expectation for children to be taking greater care over presentation and handwriting. We continue to have weekly hand-writing lessons as part of our English work, concentrating on starting each letter in the correct place.

Science

This term the children will complete their seasonal change project and continuing with the environment, will investigate plants (structure and growth).

The children will have opportunities to observe the growth and development of plants in both controlled experiments and within a natural setting.

You can help your child by identifying plants in the garden, around the local area and by discussing their purpose.

Phonics

Children will continue with daily group phonics. Spellings are given within the Phonics group and sent home on a Tuesday. Children will be quizzed on these the following Monday in the group. Please continue to help your child learn these spelling words.

Maths

The children will build up their factual knowledge of number bonds to 10, 20 and 100, and will investigate place value to and beyond 100.

As well as number work children will continue to compare, describe, estimate and measure length, time, mass and capacity, learn to name and describe 2D and 3D shapes and describe position and direction. Children will also be using money in calculation which includes finding change. Please continue to support your child to practise telling the time to the hour and half past.

Now that the children have an increased confidence and knowledge of Mathematical skills, they will begin to apply these to a greater depth in investigative and problem-solving activities.

We appreciate your continued help in encouraging your children to use these skills in every day situations such as shopping.

A weekly 'Learn-It' sheet will continue to come home with your child's latest scores on. This is purely for you to know how to help your child improve and should not be shared with others.

Please continue to use Mathletics at home with your children to consolidate their Maths skills in an accessible and fun way.
