Resilience: As you know we are big advocates for talking about feelings. We understand and teach children all feelings are okay. As humans we have a wide range of feelings and it is what we do with these feelings that is in our control. For example, it is okay to feel angry, it is not okay to hurt someone with our words or hands if we are feeling angry. When talking about resilience we have explored the idea that feeling resilient can feel like being in the sun: warm, light and hopeful. Sometimes things might happen in life that make it difficult for us to remain warm, light and hopeful. This is a bit like the clouds passing in front of the sun. Temporarily we can't see the sun or feel it but we know it remains there and we will see it once more. Knowing that feelings pass is powerful and positive self talk is essential. Other strategies we teach children are talking to a trusted adult about worries, finding some space, taking some deep breaths and doing an activity they enjoy. Keeping Our Children Safe

The Hertfordshire Safeguarding Children Partnership (HSCP) has been set up so that all agencies and organisations who work with children and young people work together to keep children safe. Call 0300 123 4043 at anytime if you are a child or young person being abused or mistreated; or if you are an adult worried about a young person. Call 999 if you're in immediate danger or a crime is being committed.

We are an Operation Encompass School— this means if the Police are called to your home, they will contact us within 48 hours with a report of the incident. A member of our safeguarding team will call you to talk about this and offer any support that might be needed from school.
